Tracking the present moment in a Rosen Method Bodywork session takes a relaxed and open receptive attitude both in the way we touch and in the way our minds operate whilst we touch. Are we tuned in or tuned out as our hands make contact? What do we tune into and what do we not pay attention to? Learning how to discern what tracks to follow and which ones to pay less attention to belongs to the art of becoming a Rosen Practitioner, and Bill and Ingrid-Maria would love to share their expertise on this subject with you.

Learning how to sensitively 'hold' a client's experience takes a certain level of attunement between practitioner and client but what are the components of this attunement?

The class will look in detail at what we track as Rosen Method bodyworkers and how we track and why and when we might want to change track.

- Tracking client's verbal recollection of their experience.
- Develop own vocabulary related to tracking the client's experience.
- Identifying tracking skills at different sections of a session (beginning, middle, end).
- How to track on multiple levels of experience simultaneously (physical, emotional, spiritual?).
